High interests also towards the development of e-resources service fields, social media services and the service developments of full-text online databases and integrated discovery service systems (PRIMO, EBSCO DISCOVERY).

Definite interests towards working with digital collections and make them available to the public in several innovative ways.

Evaluating information services from a user oriented perspective takes a high importance to me by valuable experiences in this field from the National Széchényi Library in Hungary and Loughborough University Library, UK. A high preference was to work in team and made rich competences to study and work in multinational environment during the DILL programme.

Open for the new technical developments by a really interdisciplinary personality, however mainly prefers the approaches based on Social Science and Humanities, user oriented approaches in connection with IT, Library and Information Science rather than the dominantly technical ones. The initial idea of Open Access, the transformation process of scientific publishing has appeared as a really challenging topic throughout studies and professional career.

Definite interest towards research (also in connection with library practice in a research library) by any field of LIS in connection with Humanities and Social Sciences. This interest appears especially towards the field of LIS education or other education-related issues through library work. Main aim to work in a research library, where interdisciplinary knowledge (by skills on librarianship, IT, Information Science and Humanities) can be used in various ways.
